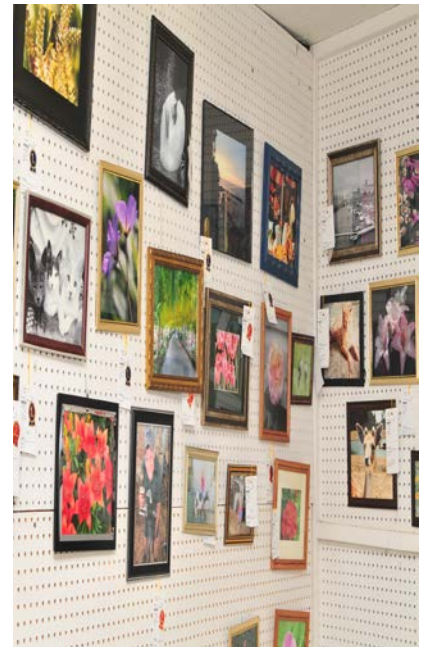

Each Garden Club must purchase one season pass when entries are made. Chairman of booth committee must purchase a season pass.
