

There will be a prize for the “Best Overall Barn Decorations”. Requirements/guidelines for Booth/Barn decorations are listed in the Attica Jr. Fair Book.

Royalty Contest – Deadline extended to Thursday, July 25. The Attica Fair Royalty Contest will be held on Tuesday, August 6th at 6:00PM. The contest is open to all Attica Fair Exhibitors and Seneca East Schools students. The entry form is on the Attica Fair website (www.atticafair.com) along with all rules and instructions for filling out the entry form. Cloverbuds – CLOVERBUDS MUST BE REGISTERED TO RECEIVE A JR. FAIR PASS.

- A **coloring contest picture** will be emailed to each club that has a registered Cloverbud!! If a Cloverbud has not received his/hers please stop by the Jr. Fair office the week before the fair between 6:00-8:00pm to pick one up, or the week of the fair during office hours. The coloring pages will be displayed. A prize for the winner in each grade level will be awarded.
- Wednesday at noon the Junior Fair board is hosting a **Cloverbud stuffed animal contest**. This is new this year. Each Cloverbud will bring their favorite stuffed animal from home. They will be “judged” by a few Junior fair members and then we will have a little parade around the fairgrounds to show off the Cloverbuds and their work. Each participant will get a fun prize!!!
- Also, we will be having a **Cloverbud “graduation”** for the kids that will be going to 4h next year. This will be held Friday at 6:30pm in the entertainment building. There will be a google doc that is put out on Facebook so please keep an eye on this for all clover buds most importantly the graduating ones.
- Cloverbud Questionnaire - We need to collect cloverbud t-shirt sizes and numbers for cloverbud graduation, please have all cloverbuds, complete this questionnaire. [Google Form Link](#)

Poster Contest – The poster contest is open to all exhibitors. There are cash prizes for the different categories if enough exhibitors participate. Poster size is limited to 22"x14" (half size poster board). Exhibitors may enter only one (1) poster. Exhibitors name, club and age (as of January 1st of the current year) must be on the back of each poster. Further guidelines are listed in the Jr. Fair Book. This will count for over all exhibitor points in the livestock departments.

Style Revue – The Style Revue will be held on Tuesday, August 6th at 6:00PM in the Entertainment building during intermission of the Royalty contest. All exhibitors that entered a sewing project will participate. The exhibitor will have their project graded before the style revue at the Miscellaneous judging on Sunday, August 4th and then participate in the style show. The judging times will be assigned and sent to each participant along with the other miscellaneous judging schedule the week of July 24th. **Each sewing project exhibitor must have their project judged at the Attica Fair in order to receive their premium.** Style Revue forms are available on the Attica Fair website. Locally Grown Beef, Sheep and Goat Forms – These forms were highly encouraged to be turned in at the same time as the Fair entry form – June 15th. If an exhibitor did not turn in their locally grown show form, please contact me. Details for these forms/shows are listed on the form and they are available on the Attica Fair website under the Jr. Fair tab.

Weigh-in Cards – These will be handed out during the livestock veterinary check-in. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have these completely filled out before crossing the scales. If not, you could be sent to the end of the line. They need to be turned in at fair weigh-in. One card per animal.

Feeder Calf Vaccinations – This form will be available on the fair website for you to print off. One form is required for each feeder calf. This must be completely filled out and signed by the veterinarian giving the vaccinations. The exhibitors need to turn these in at the time of weigh in. Suggested vaccination dates are on/or around June 1st and July 1st.

DUNF – It is your responsibility to fill out the online form **BEFORE** weigh-in. If it is not done you will be pulled from the line, online entries made and then you may return to the end of the line. The link to the online DUNF for Attica Jr. Fair will be available **AFTER** July 31st. Advisors, you will receive the DUNF link and QR code to be able to share with your members. The QR code and link will also be on the Attica Fair website. This form is state mandated and very important. This form needs to be completely filled out, one per animal. The only animals that these need to be filled out for are market steers (dairy & beef), market goats (dairy & Boer), market sheep, market hogs and market poultry (chickens, ducks, geese & turkeys), market rabbits. **New this year, feeders will have to fill out the DUNF.** The fair code is **48**.

Poultry Hatch Papers -- Poultry exhibitors must have all hatch papers with them for weigh-in. If you do not have the form, you will be sent home to get them before weighing in your animals. **This is mandated by the state.**

Booths & Booth Patrol -- This part only applies if your club will be exhibiting miscellaneous projects. I have attached the Booth Patrol list. Remember you must have 3 patrollers plus 1 advisor or an adult to guard booths during your entire shift. Please note decorating times – Saturday, Aug. 5th from 4-8PM and Sunday, Aug. 6th from 9am-7pm.

Beverages for Sale Day – These are supplied by the clubs for our buyers on Sale Day. All beverages are cases (24 pack = 1 case). Please turn in your club's **assigned** drink to the Jr. Fair office by Thursday, August 10th. You will be checked off when you turn in your beverage. See the attached list for Club requirements.

Overall Exhibitor Award- Each department will hold an over-all exhibitor contest. The over-all exhibitor will be a point system base. They will be based on skills test score, book grade, class place, clinic day participation, and showmanship place. Exhibitor with the highest points will be the over-all exhibitor. If a tie occurs there will be a test to break the tie. The point system is laid out as followed:

Skills test

- 100-90%= 10 points
- 89-80% = 8 points
- 79-70% = 5 points
- 69-60%= 4 points
- 59-50% = 3 points

Clinic Day participation 5 Points

Book grade

- A= 5 points
- B= 2 points
- C= 1 point

Showmanship placing

- Super showman= 5 points
- 1st = 5 points
- 2nd= 4 points
- 3rd= 3 points

Class Placement

- 1st place= 2 points
- 2nd= 2 points
- 3rd= 2 points
- 4th= 1 point

Best Dressed animal contest 2 points for participating

Poster Contest 5 points

- *If an exhibitor shows 2 of the same species, both of their class placements will count towards that award.*

Record Books – The only books that are mandated to be turned in are livestock (market & breeding) books. They need to be completely filled out to date and turned in at the time of taking the skills test.

One thing that has been missing from these in past years has been feed records. The department superintendents do not understand how this is left blank. Please be sure to completely fill out the book.

Livestock Skills Test – The skills test is MANDATORY for all livestock (market & breeding) exhibitors. These are graded and will count towards the overall exhibitor award. Exhibitors should study and be knowledgeable in their projects. There are separate tests based on the exhibitor's age as of January 1st, 2023.

Livestock skills test will ONLY be given on Sunday, August 4th from 1:00-4:00PM!! Each species will have their own area to take the test. When you arrive on the fairgrounds, go to the entertainment building.

Miscellaneous Judging – There will be Miscellaneous project judging on Sunday, August 4th. If an exhibitor is not able to make it to judging at the Attica Fair, it is the responsibility of the advisor to judge that project. I will have the grading forms available for you if needed. The grading form must be turned in by 4:00PM on the Sunday of fair set-up (August 4th).

Judging will be by assigned time ONLY!! These judging times will be placed on the website under the junior fair tab. Judging will be from 2:00 PM-5:00 PM. Judging times are attached to this newsletter.

Fair Passes – Passes will be \$7.00. These passes are for Cloverbuds, exhibitors that are exhibiting during fair week and advisors **ONLY**. We prefer that the advisor pay for and pick them up as a group. **If your pass is lost you will have to pay for another one.**

Pop-Ups: During Fair week the Jr fair kids have made a schedule for an event for the fair goers of all ages to come make crafts and learn the basics of different skills. These will be every day at 11am and at 4pm. The 11am ones will be under the pavilion and the 4pm ones will be some place around the fairgrounds. here is the list of what we have in store for you:

Animal Sale Declaration Form – This form was new in 2021 and must be filled out completely by the exhibitor and signed by the exhibitor's parent. A copy of the form is available on the Attica Fair website under the Jr. Fair page. **This form MUST be filled out and turned in to Brenda Snavelly by 9:00PM the day of weigh-in.**

Livestock Sale Transactions – There will be a limit of **TWO COMMERCIAL** sale transaction per market livestock exhibitor. This is NOT limiting the number of projects you bring, it is only limiting the number of sale transactions you have as an exhibitor. The Attica Fair Sale Committee will have a market/packer bid for your market animals – steers, hogs, sheep, goats, rabbits and poultry. All market hogs, market poultry, rabbit meat pens and fryers, male market lambs, male market goats and steers are terminal. Grand and Reserve Champion animal exhibitors are still responsible for obtaining their commercial buyers and the Overall Grand steer hog are responsible for finding buyers for the meat of their animals. All Grand and Reserve Champion market animals must be terminated/processed by Bellevue Meats. There will be **NO DRESSED & DELIVERED** for rabbits and poultry. All rabbits and poultry are terminal and will go to the packer/processor.

NOTE FROM THE SALE COMMITTEE.....

Just a reminder that the ***Sale Declaration Form is a Mandatory form***. We ask that each Exhibitor complete one form listing all Market Animals. Even if you only have 2 animals, you still need to complete this form and turn it in on Monday, August 7th by 9:00 p.m. or at the conclusion of the Barn Meeting.

Let's review the information on the form. You have 3 Options to choose from:

1. **SALE TRANSACTION** – The animal will go through the commercial livestock sale on Saturday. You will receive the commercial bid and the base bid from the packer.
2. **BASE BID ONLY** – The animal does not go through the commercial livestock sale. You will receive the packer bid for the animal only. If you have more than (2) transactions, you may select this for transaction #3 and 4, etc and the Sale Committee will market the animal for you.
3. **OPT OUT** - If you have more than (2) transactions, you may select this with no fee for transaction #3, 4, etc. and the animal is your responsibility **HOWEVER...** remember Attica Fair is a **terminal Fair** for Steers, Hogs, Male Lambs, Male Goats, Rabbits, and Poultry. Those animals do not have this option. **If you have 2 transactions or less, there is a \$50 opt-out fee per animal.**

YOU MUST MARK A BOX FOR EACH ANIMAL.

Feeders: All Feeders calves must go through the Back to the Farm (BTF) Sale in order to be eligible for the Commercial Livestock Sale. You can Opt Out of the BTF sale, but it will be a \$50 fee per feeder and that animal cannot go through the Commercial Livestock sale. However, if you have more than 2 transactions and you choose to "opt out" your feeders as transaction #3 or #4 and there will be no fee.

If an animal you chose as Base Bid only or Opt Out happens to win Grand or Reserve that animal now becomes (1) of your transactions and you will need to make a change. If this happens, you will be contacted to make a switch. **The only exception to the (2) transaction limit is if you happen to have more than 2 Grand or Reserve winners!**

Thank You Cards – New this year we will be providing the award thank yous. These will need to be turned in before the award is released from the Jr fair office to the exhibitor. We will let the exhibitor take a picture with their banner but then take it back to the office until we receive the Thank you. These thank yous need to be turned in by Saturday August 10th at 8pm.

Sale thank yous: Please remind the exhibitors & parents to have **thank you cards and stamps with them at the fair**. Try to have the exhibitors get their thank you notes done during the fair so they do not leave and forget to turn them in which delays their sale checks. The thank you's need turned in by October 1st so there is no penalty on the exhibitor's check.

Remember to have exhibitors turn their thank you cards into the Jr. Fair mailboxes ready to mail. **Do not mail these on your own**, they have to be checked off of a list for the exhibitor to receive their sale check.

The following needs to be labeled correctly & completely: (front of envelope) exhibitor name & return address, a stamp, & buyer name & address, (back of envelope) animal project, trophy or award. Please make sure everything is printed clearly & formatted correctly on the envelopes. There have been issues in the past with this & the post office will not accept them. If exhibitors do not turn in all of their thank you cards their sale check will not get mailed to them. Exhibitors need to find their buyers and personally thank them during the sale.

Animal Barn Assignments: You are only allowed one extra bail of shavings/ straw per exhibitor in the barn areas.

- **Cattle** – Cattle Barn (ONLY use straw or pine shavings for bedding)
- **Goats** – Small Animal Barn (ONLY use straw or shavings for bedding)
- **Hogs** – Show Arena Barn (ONLY use shavings for bedding)
- **Poultry** – Show Arena Barn (ONLY use shavings for bedding)
- **Rabbits** – Show Arena Barn (ONLY use shavings for bedding)
- **Sheep** – Show Arena Barn (ONLY use shavings for bedding)

FAIR WEEK – AUGUST 6-10, 2024

Saturday, August 3rd:

- **Livestock Skills Test** – 1:00 PM – 4:00 PM

Monday, August 5th:

Livestock Veterinary Check In – 3:00PM-5:00PM -- All livestock animals, except poultry and rabbits, must be brought in through the far east drive (driveway beyond the campers). Signs will be posted to help show what driveway to use. There will be a veterinarian standing there to check every

animal that comes in the gate. If you arrive before the vet is there you must wait. **ALL ANIMALS MUST BE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS BY 5:00 PM ON THE DAY OF WEIGH-IN.**

Livestock Weigh In – Order of weigh in will be as follows:

- HOGS 3:30 – 5:00 PM
- POULTRY 3:30 – 5:00 PM (in Small Animal Barn)
- RABBITS 5:00 – 6:00 PM (in Small Animal Barn)
- FEEDERS 5:30 PM (Beef, Dairy, Dairy-Beef) (Usual place.)
- STEERS following Feeders (Beef, Dairy)
- SHEEP 5:30 PM (West side of show barn, where sheep pens normally are.)
- GOATS following Sheep (Dairy, Boer)

This will take place in the show building. Everything that needs to be completely filled out and turned in at weigh-in is: weigh-in cards (available at vet check in), Animal Sale Declaration Form, hog Ractopamine Affidavit and feeder vaccination forms. We will have someone checking these forms and if they are not filled out you will have to go to the end of the line and fill them out right. We have a new form, Animal Sale Declaration Form that is available on the Attica Fair website. **This form MUST be filled out and turned in to Brenda Snavelly by 9:00PM the day of weigh-in.** All poultry will be checked-in and weighed in the small animal barn. The poultry will be leg banded and you will have to provide all of your hatch papers. Leg bands are the property of the fair so please remember to turn these in when your animals are released or your premiums will be forfeited.

Barn Meeting – Immediately following weigh-in. This meeting will be held to go over any last-minute things, reminders and questions. The meeting is for parents, exhibitors and advisors. We would really like everyone to be present, please make sure you are listening for an announcement or you are paying attention as to when weigh-in is over, there is no set time. PLEASE tell all of your exhibitors this!

Water bottles will be provided only to the exhibitors during the show. This will take place in the show barns at the time of each of the animal shows.

Show orders for spectators will be placed on a table in the corresponding animal barn 30 minutes prior to the start of each of the animal shows.

Important information about Saturday and Sunday of the Fair:

Saturday, August 12th:

Back to the Farm Sale – 9:00 AM -- This is for feeder calves only and will sell in this order: Beef, Dairy-Beef, Dairy. Animal will be in Sale ring with the exhibitor. Thank-you cards are not mandatory for this part of the sale.

Commercial Livestock Sale – 10:00 AM -- This is for all market livestock animals. Thank-you cards are mandatory for this part of the sale. All of the exhibitors need to come in the office to find the correct buyer number(s) for their animal. Once they have found their buyer number(s) they need to go out to the table in the small animal barn and find the buyer address. Please remind the exhibitors & parents to have thank you cards and stamps with them at the fair. Encourage exhibitors to write their thank you notes during the fair so they turn them before leaving the fair. Thank you cards should be turned into

the Jr. Fair mailbox ready to mail. Do not mail these on your own; they have to be checked off of a list for the exhibitor to receive their check.

The following needs to be labeled correctly & completely: (front of envelope) exhibitor name & return address, a stamp, & buyer name & address, (back of envelope) animal project, trophy or award. Please make sure everything is printed clearly & formatted correctly on the envelopes. There have been issues in the past with this & the post office will not accept them. If exhibitors do not turn in all of their thank you cards their sale check will not get mailed to them.

Livestock/Miscellaneous Project Release – Champions and producer animals will release from about 8:00 AM–10:00 AM. All back to the farm and breeding will release from 10:00 AM–12:00 PM. All miscellaneous projects (booth displays) will release from 8:00 AM–12:00 PM.

Premium Payouts – These will be passed out in the Jr. Fair office from 12:30-1:30PM. We will be using two (2) lines for payout. Pay close attention to the signs that will be posted at the door to the Jr. Fair office. Premiums are paid out by CLUB name not individual last name.
