 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup white sugar $\frac{1}{4}$ cup oil $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sour cream

2 teaspoons vanilla

GLAZE $\frac{1}{2}$ cup powdered sugar $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Vanilla

4 teaspoons of milk

1. Grease 8" x 4" loaf pan with butter
2. Cut apples into $\frac{1}{4}$ " cubes. Mix with brown sugar, ginger and cinnamon and toss with spatula. Let stand for 5-10 minutes
3. Add flour, salt & soda. Set aside.
4. Combine egg white, sugar, oil, sour cream & vanilla - whisk until combined. Transfer about $\frac{3}{4}$ of apple into egg mixture. Stir and add flour mixture just until flour disappears.

5. Put into the loaf pan. Tap to settle the batter. Spoon the rest of the apples over the top.
6. Bake at 350 degrees 55-60 minutes.
